 - B. You are a member of the Church of England (*or of a Church in communion with the Church of England*) and, not a resident in the parish, but have attended public worship in the parish for at least six months, Or
 - C. You are a member in good standing of a Church (*not in communion with the Church of England*) which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and have attended public worship in the parish for at least six months.
